

Important information about your wire transfers.

Your day to day banking transactions may require you to receive or send wires.

Gather and enter all your details, accurately:

In order to make sure your wires get to the right place, (i.e. your bank account or your recipient's bank account) -on time, you'll need to enter all of the information listed below:

Recipient Name	Recipient Bank Name
Recipient Address	Recipient Bank Address
Recipient Account Number	Swift Code/ Routing Number
Intermediary Bank†	Currency Type

If you're sending a wire to a fellow Scotiabank account holder located in another country, remember to include the Branch transit number. **Be sure to take the time to verify all of your details beforehand. Providing accurate details will save you both time and money.**

Save money when you ask persons sending funds to use the direct deposit method instead of local incoming wires.

Should you need to receive money from someone banking at another local bank, ask them to direct deposit the funds into your account using online banking.
