Scotiabank wraps up Earth Month with tree plantings and net-zero focused initiatives.

Scotiabank employees wrapped up Earth Month (April) by leading a tree panting exercise with partner, the Walkers Institute for Regenerative Research, Education and Design (WIRRED). Through this effort, 100 sea grape trees were planted at the Walkers Reserve, under the One Tree for Every Bajan initiative.

Sea grape trees are endemic to the east coast of Barbados and thrive in the harsh environment which includes high wind speeds, saline laden breezes coming off the ocean, low water levels and high temperatures. The trees will sequester carbon which mitigates the negative impact of climate change. They will also stabilise the soil on the slopes where they were planted, diminishing soil erosion. Additionally, the trees will retain water in the soil and add biomass creating more nutritious soil to support the growth of other trees and plants.

Elize Rostant, Programme Manager at WIRRED indicated "As we face the greatest crisis of our time, that of climate change, it cannot be business as usual if we are to survive. Ensuring our populations have clean air, unpolluted water and nourishing food is critical to our survival. Therefore, working with and being supported by partners like Scotiabank is key to succeeding in this vision as WIRRED continues to create a model of regenerative practices, connecting and reconnecting people to the environment."

Furthermore, globally, Scotiabank is now accepting grant submissions for its <u>Net-Zero</u> <u>Research Fund</u>. Not-for-profit and charitable organizations developing research and opportunities to decarbonize key sectors of our economy have until May 31, 2023, to submit their proposals for funding.
