Scotiabank supports youth literacy with \$10,000 donation to Babb's Reading Clinic.

The global pandemic has highlighted how critically important it is, now more than ever, to have access to literacy and learning support. Even before the pandemic, The Babb's Reading Clinic has been helping our young people enhance their literacy skills for the past 5 years. This year, Scotiabank has contributed \$10,000 towards the Reading Clinic to help male students who are about to enter Secondary School and are in need additional support to enhance their literacy skills.

Specialist Tutors provide these at-risk young men with free instructions in basic word recognition strategies, such as activating phonemic awareness and understanding structural analysis. Reading Comprehension Techniques such as, analyzing text structure, identifying the main idea in a passage, and monitoring of comprehension are taught. The boys are also engaged activities such as problem- solving scenarios, and educational field trips.

Dr. Astra Babb - Founder of the Reading Clinic commented "I tell my students all the time -if you read you will learn, but you must learn to read. We aim to provide a foundation for our boys, to give them enough scaffolding to take with them as they transition to the next level of their quest for education."

The funding we received from the Bank has helped us with the tutoring costs and purchasing books for each boy in the Reading Clinic.
